Dear Library Staff,

Tomorrow, after four months of closure, the Vancouver Public Library re-opens five of its locations and expands takeout services to better meet the needs of our City. Although this is only one step in our graduated re-opening plan, I write on behalf of the Library Board to celebrate this important milestone with you and to thank you for helping us reach it.

In many ways it may still feel difficult to celebrate. The past months have been sombre for most of us and that can make it challenging to recognize the joy in tomorrow's accomplishment. It has been a time of profound sorrow, in grieving the loss of lives to the pandemic and the temporary loss of our ways of living. It has been a time of frustration, as we recognize the deep divisions that have grown among us and the endless need to fight for racial justice and equity. And increasingly it has been a time of dismay, as we see, in certain places near and far, science and truth succumbing to opinions and fear.

It is precisely in times like these that Libraries are needed most. The work you do each day chips away at the problems our communities face. I also recognize that our gradual re-opening means that not everyone has returned to work yet and that some of you continue to await recall. We recognize these hardships and commit to continuing to do all we can to advocate for your safe return to work. Board members have and will continue to take every opportunity to remind our City leaders of the vitally important work that you do in support of our community and in helping us all rise from the challenges we face.
