British Isles Genealogical Research at the Vancouver Public Library

The Library also receives British genealogy magazines, and subscribes to several relevant databases. This guide provides further details.

The Vancouver Public Library does **not** have any birth, marriage and death records for the British Isles, nor does it have indexes to these records. However, VPL does have some useful secondary materials on the topic, and there are resources elsewhere in the Lower Mainland and online that can help in the search for these important records. These are described in this guide.

Brian W. Hutchison Genealogical Scholarship

1911 Census Released

After a vigorous public campaign, the 1911 census of Canada was released to Library and Archives Canada (LAC) in July. This followed Parliament's passage in late June of Bill S-18. The legislation provides for the full public release of all Canadian census records, up to and including 2001, after a 92-year waiting period.

The 1911 census documented over 7 million people living in Canada. The entire census has been scanned, and is available on the LAC website at:

Unfortunately, the paper record of the 1911 census was destroyed after it was microfilmed in 1955. The quality of filming was inconsistent and some records are difficult to read.

The database can be searched geographically. Two independent projects to transcribe and create a nominal index have also started:

Microfilm copies of the 1911 census are not yet available for consultation at Library and Archives Canada, the Vancouver Public Library, or any other location. They are expected to become available in the near future.

Who Was Where - More Canadian Directories Online

Phase 2 of Library and Archives Canada Who Was Where?: Canadian Directories Online was launched in July. 80 directories -- from Halifax and Ottawa -- have been added to the 15 included in the first phase, for a total of 95 directories now fully digitized and searchable online at:

The directories date mainly from the latter part of the 19th century. Plans for future additions include directories for Kingston and London, Ontario.

New Research Guide on Early Land Settlement Records

The Archives of Ontario has produced a new research guide (#215) entitled From Grant to Patent: A Guide to Early Land Settlement Records, ca. 1790 to ca. 1850. Halifax City Death Registers

In 1884, the federal government began collecting death statistics from major Canadian cities. In Halifax, the program continued until 1908, when the provincial government began registering Nova Scotia deaths.

Two registers for the City of Halifax, comprising almost 18,000 records, have survived. They cover the years 1890-1908, with a gap from 1884-1889.

In winter 2004-2005, volunteers from the Genealogical Association of Nova Scotia worked with staff at Nova Scotia Archives and Records Management to develop a searchable electronic index of the registers. It is now available online at:

Blogging Basics for Genealogists

First there was e-mail and message boards, and now there are blogs. Increasingly, individuals and organizations are using web logs to share information. A blog is a web page, containing brief items of information, arranged in chronological order. It is dynamic, and is established and maintained directly by the author. A blog can be created quickly and easily, and does not require the web editing skills necessary to create standard web pages. Blogs also do not require the uploading of new and revised pages to a remote server. In some ways, they provide the same functions as newsletters and message boards, but are easier to use and organize.

Blogs often take the form of a journal or newsletter, with regular updates. The genealogical community has been blogging enthusiastically for quite some time. Subscribers to the popular **Eastman's Online Genealogy Newsletter** may be surprised to know that this free, daily newsletter is in fact a blog. (You can see it at http://eogn.typepad.com/eastmans_online_genealogy).

How can blogs be useful to you as a genealogist? Well, you could create a blog for your surname, or for a specific locality. If you belong to a genealogical society, it might be a useful way for the group to share information. You could also use a blog to track the progress of an individual or group genealogy project.
