A potentially useful resource for genealogists with roots in Manitoba, this series compiles information from dozens of newspapers published in 19th-century Manitoba over a 25-year period.

Each volume is divided into separate sections for Births, Marriages and Deaths (the first volume includes marriage and death information only), with names arranged in alphabetical sequence. Most entries include useful identifying information, such as date of marriage, name of father, bride and groom's places of residence, etc. Page references are provided which can be used to locate original newspaper notices.



Vancouver Public Library Launches Re-Designed Website



In mid-February, the Vancouver Public Library launched its newly re-designed website. Among changes of special interest to genealogists is the new ***Finding Genealogy Information*** section. While much of the information existed on the old website, the new configuration places this information much more prominently, with a link from many sub-pages on the website. It can also be accessed directly at www.vpl.ca/find/cat/C442/.

Finding Genealogy Information provides detailed information on many kinds of records, links to genealogy charts, recommended strategies for searching the library catalogue, and much more.

New Databases

The Canadian Genealogy Centre has recently added two new databases to its suite of free, searchable online databases:

Railway Porters is a nominal index derived from records of the Employees Provident Fund of the Intercolonial and Prince Edward Island Railway, a precursor to the Canadian National Railways. The database provides access to 21,170 employees information who received allowances (including Afro-Canadian porters). The database includes images of the original records.

Update: Nanaimo Family History Society Passenger List Transcribing Project

In March 2008, the Nanaimo Family History Society reported that indexing of microfilm T-490 has been completed. The records cover passenger arrivals at Quebec ports during the period of 29 May 1907 to 8 July 1907. With the addition of these records, the database now comprises 396,261 listings from 762 ship arrivals.

Records from T-491 (10 July 1907 to 6 September 1907) are expected to follow shortly.

Some Family by Donald Harman Akenson

A genealogy-themed book, ***Some Family: The Mormons and How Humanity Keeps Track of Itself*** by Donald Harman Akenson was recently honoured as a finalist in the contest for British Columbia's National Award for Canadian Non-Fiction, the largest non-fiction book prize in Canada.

Akenson's book explores and explains the cultural fascination with genealogy, focusing particularly on the efforts of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints. The following is the jury citation for ***Some Family***:

With a prose style that is both witty and wise, historian Donald Akenson explores and explains our culture's fascination and obsession with genealogy. His model is the massive genealogical database created by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints - or the Mormons - and their efforts to provide a single narrative on how humanity keeps track of itself. Rather than focus solely on the motives of the Mormons in attempting such an impossible task, Akenson applies his enormous gifts of scholarship and intellect to show how genealogy provides a significant tool in tracing our social and economic history. And he does so with clarity, charm and humour.

Some Family was published by McGill-Queen's University Press in 2007 and is available at the Vancouver Public Library. (929.1 A31s)

More Saskatchewan Vital Events Indexes Online

Saskatchewan Health's project of automating access to vital events information continues. The most recent records to go online are indexes to death records. Legislation allows the release of information concerning deaths that occurred more than 70 years ago. The database currently comprises records of deaths prior to 1917. When the death index is complete, work on the marriage index will begin. The marriage index will cover marriages that occurred more than 70 years ago.

Ancestors on Board - Passenger Lists Now Complete!



AncestorsOnBoard.com now provides coverage of passenger lists from 1890-1960. These records comprise 24 million names from 164,000 passenger lists.

The passenger lists document individuals who sailed from U.K. ports to Australia, Canada, India, New Zealand, South Africa, the U.S.A. and other destinations worldwide.

Searching the index is free; if your results include names which you would like to follow up, you can purchase a transcript and / or an image of the original passenger list. Transcript details provided for each individual include: Name, Date and Port of departure, Destination port and country, Age, Marital status, Sex, and Occupation.

Welsh Research Tip



A free index to Welsh Wills is available on the National Archives (U.K.) website. To search the index:

- Go to www.a2a.org.uk/search/index.asp
- Enter a Welsh name in the **Keyword (or phrase)** search box, e.g. *John Button*.
- Open the drop-down list under **Location of Archives** and scroll down to select **National Library of Wales, Department of Collection Services**.
- If desired, enter a range of years in the **Dates of Archives** boxes.
- Click on the red **Search** button.

Results will indicate files containing wills in the National Library of Wales that correspond to individuals with that name.



News from ScotlandsPeople

A recent update to ScotlandsPeople, the premier online research resource for Scottish genealogists (www.scotlandspeople.gov.uk/), comprises Statutory Registers of 1906 Births, 1931 Marriages, and 1956 Deaths.

A major update including many corrections to the indexing of district names in the Statutory Birth, Death and Marriage indexes has also been implemented. **ScotlandsPeople** advises that the updates may change the results of previous searches.



New Finnish Research Guide from FamilySearch

FamilySearch.org recently announced the publication of a free new research guide for genealogists with Finnish roots.

Part of FamilySearch's continuing *Finding Records of Your Ancestors* series, the Finnish guide offers step-by-step instructions, showing users which records to search, what to look for, and what tools to use. Other titles in the series cover African-Americans, Denmark, France, Iceland, Italy, Mexico, Norway and Sweden.

The archives comprises 820,000 pages from almost 13,000 issues. The database can be browsed and searched for free, although a paid subscription is required to view articles in full.
