New CD-ROMs at VPL

Two new CD-ROM products have been added to the genealogy CD-ROM station in the History and Government Division (Level 6, Central Branch).

Canadians in the 1870 Census reveals all 223,981 Canadian households in the 1870 U.S. federal census.

Le Tanguay contains the text of the 19th century works of Cyprien Tanguay, including his famous, 7-volume *Dictionnaire genealogique des familles canadiennes* and *Repertoire general du clerge canadien.* Also included is the supplementary *Complement Tanguay*, first published in 1957, and updated in 1977.

Both CD-ROMs are available for use in the History Division, whenever the Library is open.
